

Joseph's Big Promotion: <u>Lesson 22 Visuals</u>

- Pharaoh woke up upset because he had two dreams in which he couldn't understand the meaning.
- Joseph was in prison for two years after Joseph told the cupbearer to tell Pharaoh about him.
- Joseph was brought up from the prison dungeon. He had to shave and change his clothes to become presentable for Pharaoh.
- Pharaoh had heard that Joseph had the ability to interpret dreams. Joseph said he could not do it but God could.



- Pharaoh's first dream was about cows.
- Seven fat cows came up out of the Nile River and then seven skinny cows came up out of the Nile River.
- The seven skinny cows ate the seven fat cows.
- Pharaoh then had a second dream about seven heads of full and healthy grain followed by seven heads of thin and unhealthy grain.
- The Lord gave Joseph the interpretation.



- The seven good cows and the seven good heads of grain meant there would be seven years of great harvest.
- The seven skinny cows and the seven thin heads of grain meant there would be seven years of great famine to come after the seven years of great harvest.
- Joseph told Pharaoh that he should look for a discerning and wise man to be in charge of saving a fifth of the grain during the seven years of harvest.
- Pharaoh decided Joseph was to be that discerning and wise man to be in charge.



- Joseph would be in charge over all the land of Egypt.
- Joseph was 30 years old when
 Pharaoh promoted him to be in charge over all of Egypt.
- Joseph had been either a slave or in prison for 13 years.
- Pharaoh made sure Joseph got the best clothes of fine linen.
- Isaiah 64:6 says that our righteousness is like filthy rags.
- Jesus is the only one with perfect righteousness.
- If you are saved, you are covered with the righteousness of Jesus.



- Joseph stored up so much grain during the 7 years of harvest that it was too much to count. It was more than could be counted.
- Manasseh and Ephraim were the two sons of Joseph and his wife.
- When the famine started, Joseph opened up the storehouses and sold grain.
