

The Golden Calf: Exodus 31:18-32:8 <u>Lesson 35 Visuals</u>

- God told Moses to come back on top of Mt. Sinai because God wanted to give him stone tablets with the Ten Commandments on them.
- Joshua went up there with Moses because Joshua was his assistant.
- Moses left Aaron and Hur in charge of the Israelites.
- Moses was on top of Mt. Sinai for 40 days and 40 nights.



- When the Israelites looked up, the Lord's glory look like a consuming fire. It looked scary to them.
- The Lord told Moses that the Israelites were to take up and offering to collect gold, silver and other things of value.
- That collection was to be used to make the tabernacle and all the things that were to go inside the tabernacle.
- The tabernacle was to be like a portable church that could be moved from place to place.



- The tabernacle would be a holy place. Holy means set apart for the Lord. So the tabernacle would be a place set apart for the Lord.
- The ark of the covenant would be dangerous to touch or to come too close to because God's glorious presence would be in the ark of the covenant.
- Poles needed to be attached to the ark of the covenant so it could be moved from place to place.
- Two gold Cherubim were on top of the ark. (Cherubim are angels with wings.)



- The wings of those gold cherubim covered the mercy seat.
- God said to Moses, "I will meet with you there above the Mercy seat.
- The mercy seat is so special because this was the place where the Lord would give mercy instead of the punishment deserved.
- The Israelites had to follow God's instructions in order to receive God's mercy.
- Animals had to be continually sacrificed so that a Holy God could live among the Israelites.



- The Lord God carved the two stone tablets and wrote the Ten Commandments on them with His finger and then gave them to Moses.
- Moses was on top of Mt. Sinai for 40 days and 40 nights.
- To the Israelites, it looked like Moses was inside a consuming fire on top of Mt. Sinai.
- The Israelites were afraid Moses wasn't coming back.
- The Israelites asked Aaron to make gods for them that would lead them.



- Aaron melted down the Israelite's gold jewelry and formed an idol for the Israelites to worship. Aaron formed that idol into a golden calf.
- The first two commandments were broken when Aaron made the golden calf.
- Commandment #1: There is one God; you shall have no other gods.
- Commandment #2: Do not make an idol; do not bow down to an idol.



- God had told Moses on top of Mt. Sinai to take up a collection to make the tabernacle. But the Israelites took up a collection of gold to make that golden calf, an idol, an object of false worship.
- The Israelites gave credit to the golden calf for leading them out of Egypt.
- Aaron called for a festival to the One True Lord God; but the Israelites worshipped the golden calf at the festival.
