

## Approaching a Holy God: Leviticus 1 - 27 <u>Lesson 38 Visuals</u>

- Exodus ends with a problem.
   Moses was unable to enter the Tent of Meeting.
- The presence of God was inside the Tent of Meeting.
- The sin of the Israelites needed to be dealt with before Moses could enter the Tent of Meeting.
- Leviticus is a record of God's instructions for the Israelites.
- The Israelites were camped at Mt. Sinai when God gave all these instructions.



- The Israelites were camped out there at Mt. Sinai for one year.
- These instructions were to help the Israelites deal with their sin and become holy.
- The Israelites needed to become holy so that a Holy God could live among them.
- God is just so He must punish those guilty of sin.
- In the book of Leviticus, God gave instructions that an animal could be a substitute and receive punishment for sin instead of the person who committed the sin.



- God is still just and must punish those guilty of sin. But today, Jesus Christ is available to be our substitute and take the punishment for our sin.
- The Day of Atonement was one day every year when the High Priest went into the Most Holy Place and spoke with the Lord at the Mercy Seat.
- On the Day of Atonement, the High Priests asked the Lord to give mercy and forgive the sins of the Israelites.



- Only the High Priest was allowed to go into the Most Holy Place and it was only once per year on the Day of Atonement.
- All these instructions were given by God so that the Israelites could be holy.
- The priests were held to an even higher standard the rest of the Israelites.
- Aaron's two older sons were Nadab and Abihu. Nadab and Abihu disobeyed God and did not follow God's instruction for their work as priests.



- Right after they sinned, Nadab and Abihu approached the presence of God and fire came out from the Lord's presence and killed them.
- It is dangerous for a sinful person to approach a holy God.
- If Nadab and Abihu had feared the Lord, they would have obeyed God.
- The Lord God said, "I will demonstrate My holiness to those who are near Me and I will reveal My glory before all people."



- Eleazar and Ithamar replaced Nadab and Abihu as priests. They were Aaron's younger sons, the younger brothers of Nadab and Abihu.
- The key verse in Leviticus is Lev. 11:44 "I am the Lord your God, consecrate yourselves and be holy, because I am holy."
- The Lord God says in Leviticus 11:44, "Be holy, because I am holy."

God gave the Israelites food laws. They were not allowed to eat pork or shellfish.



- The Jewish food laws kept the Israelites separate from the neighboring nations.
- God wanted the Israelites to be separate from the other nations because those other nations worshipped what idols.
- God instructed Israelites to celebrate seven annual feasts.
- The Israelites learned to take God's command seriously and follow God's instructions.
- Numbers, the next book, tells us that God's instructions solved their sin problem.



- Numbers 1:1 says "The Lord spoke to Moses in the Tent of Meeting in the Desert of Sinai."
- God spoke to Moses in the Tent of Meeting.
- Once the Israelites sin problem was dealt with, Moses was able to enter the Tent of Meeting and a Holy God was able to live among the Israelites.
