

## **David Chosen to be Future King:**

## **1 Samuel 16**

## **Lesson 61 Visuals**

- God told Samuel He has chosen one of Jesse's sons to be king. One of his sons would be chosen to be the future king to eventually replace Saul.
- The leaders of Bethlehem thought they were in trouble when they saw Samuel. Samuel explained he came in peace and was there to make a sacrifice to the Lord.
- When Samuel saw Jesse's oldest and tallest son, he thought, "Surely this is the one the LORD has chosen?"
- But the LORD told Samuel not to consider his appearance or his height. Then the LORD said that Eliab was not the one.



- The LORD said He does not look at the things that man looks at for man looks at the outward appearance.
- But the LORD God looks at the heart.
- The LORD God was looking for a man after God's heart. A man after God's heart is a man who loves God and wants to obey Him.
- Jesse's had seven sons there at the sacrifice. But God did not choose any of them to be the future king.
- When Samuel asked Jesse if he had any other sons, Jesse said, "Yes, my youngest David."
- David was not at the sacrifice because he was taking care of his father's sheep. David was a shepherd.
- At that time, many people looked down on shepherds.



- When David entered, the LORD said to Samuel, "Rise and anoint him, he is the one."
- Samuel's had oil in his horn. He poured that oil on David's head to anoint David as king.
- From that day on, the Spirit of the LORD came on David in power.
- When the Spirit of the LORD came on Daivd, he was changed from being an ordinary guy to being a brave warrior with great wisdom, ability and faith in the living God.
- After David was anointed king, he did not immediately become king. Instead, he returned to his work as a shepherd.
- The Spirit of the LORD departed from Saul when God rejected him as king. So the Spirit of the LORD left Saul and now was on David.
- God sent an evil spirit to torment Saul.



- Saul's servants suggested that someone playing the harp for him would help Saul when that evil spirit came on him.
- One of Saul's servants recommended a harpist named David.
- David was described as a brave warrior who speaks well, is fine looking and who has the LORD with him.
