- David normally led his army in times of war.
 But this springtime, David decided to stay in his grand palace in Jerusalem.
- David was up high on his palace roof when he spotted a young, beautiful woman bathing.
- When he spotted a woman bathing without clothes on, he should have turned his head quickly and looked away.
- Even though David found out that she was married, David told his servants to bring her to him.
- The 7th commandment is "Do not commit adultery."
- David decided to break the 7th commandment so that he could be with Bathsheba.



- A few weeks after they committed adultery,
 Bathsheba told David that she was pregnant.
- David wanted to get Uriah home from war so that Uriah and everyone else would assume that Uriah was the father.
- David told Joab, the commander of his army, to send Uriah to him.
- After meeting with Uriah, David sent Uriah to his house. But instead of going home to his wife, Uriah slept at the entrance of the palace.
- David's plan B was to get Uriah drunk enough that he would go home to his wife. But it did not work.
- David's plan C was that he arranged for Uriah to be killed on the battlefield.
- David's unconfessed sin led David to become a murderer.
- Confessing sin makes the problem of sin better.
- Covering sin makes the problem of sin worse.

- David married Bathsheba after she finished grieving for her dead husband. David thought he had gotten away with his sin.
- After the baby was born to David and Bathsheba, God sent the prophet Nathan to David to tell him a story from the Lord.

- When a traveler came to visit the rich man, the rich man wanted to cook a delicious meal for his guest. The rich man did not choose one of his own lambs. Instead, the rich man took the little lamb from the poor man and made a meal for his guest.
